## 3:00pm: Welcome and Updates:

- Update on CHIPO National Advisory Committee: The NAC is currently in the process of making plans for future partnerships and membership development and outreach. Other goals include improving state and federal advocacy efforts and strengthening federal partnerships. More updates will be available at the next meeting – stay tuned!
- Data collection and analysis are complete for the project to better understand disparities in liver cancer awareness, knowledge, and screening rates among highly impacted communities (including African and Caribbean communities) in the United States. We are currently beginning work on a communications campaign, which should be ready by the end of this year, and we will be hosting a webinar on preliminary results later in March. Stay tuned for details!
- Hep B United has begun hosting monthly state advocacy calls on the second Tuesday of every month at 3pm Eastern Time. The next one will be on March 8<sup>th</sup> and then April 12<sup>th</sup>. Topics of these calls will include state budget/appropriations advocacy, state implementation of new ACIP recommendations for universal adult hepatitis B vaccination, requesting state and local proclamations for Hepatitis Awareness Month, and updates and additions to state advocacy resource pages, among other topics. **3:10 pm: Presentation:** Breaking Down Barriers for Hepatitis B Screening in the Bronx West African Community: Education in Collaboration with Faith-Based Organizations. Presenter: Fatima Omarufilo, MPH, PN, Patient Navigator, Montefiore Starfish Program, Bronx, NY

- Presentation slides are attached.
- This project started in 2017.
- Educational events have continued virtually, despite the pandemic.
- People are given blood pressure cuffs and logs as part of the project, for which the Starfish program has gotten designated funds, after paying for these at the start of the program.
- Common myths and misconceptions were shared in both the educational presentation and the informational in-language brochures, which helped quite a bit with addressing these. The most persistent myth seems to be that hepatitis B can be transmitted by sharing meals with someone who is living with HBV only 67% of participants expressed comfort with this even after the educational session, demonstrating that stigma is still very persistent.
- Many (50%) community members believed that HBV was the same as TB and believed that they had previously been vaccinated when they received a TB test.
- Offering all services (testing, vaccination, and linkage to care) all in one place has proven to be very effective and has helped a lot in addressing loss to follow up.
- As rates of HBV vaccination increased (which happened more once vaccination was given at Montefiore as well), investigators found that uptake of COVID vaccines increased as well. Cultural competency helps to address vaccine hesitancy.
