



Talk to your health care provider to see if you are a candidate for an approved drug. | Fact Check: Herbal remedies do not cure #hepatitisB. Although there is no cure, there are approved drugs for both adults and children that control the hepatitis B virus, which helps reduce the risk of developing more serious liver disease. | If you're living with hepatitis B, talk to your doctor about management as well as testing for liver cancer. Regular screening for liver cancer and early detection are the most effective ways to improve treatment success. |






