

What Is #HepatitisB? Hepatitis B is the most common serious liver infection in the world. It is caused by the hepatitis B virus that attacks and injures the liver, and if left unmanaged, can lead to more serious liver disease, including liver cancer. 













MANAGEMENT








If you are living with hep B, you can still get married and have children, have a job and live a normal life.







PREVENTION



It takes only a few shots to protect yourself and your loved ones against #hepatitisB for a lifetime. The hepatitis B vaccine is a safe and effective vaccine that is recommended for all infants at birth, for children up to 18 years, for all adults, ages 19-59, and for adults age 60+ at high risk for hepatitis B.



SYMPTOMS





TESTING












TRANSMISSION



The hepatitis B virus is transmitted through blood and bodily fluids. If you are unvaccinated or unsure of your hepatitis B status and are exposed to the hepatitis B virus through direct contact with infected blood, a timely "postexposure prophylaxis" (PEP) can prevent an infection.
