



What Is #HepatitisB? Hepatitis B is the most common serious liver infection in the world. It is caused by the hepatitis B virus that attacks and injures the liver, and if left unmanaged, can lead to more serious liver disease, including liver cancer. Importantly, #HepB can be treated, prevented, and managed.









MANAGEMENT

Your community will be there to support you throughout your hepatitis B journey.









There is no cure for hepatitis B at this time.

PREVENTION




It takes only a few shots to protect yourself and your loved ones against #hepatitisB for a lifetime. The hepatitis B vaccine is a safe and effective vaccine that is recommended for all infants at birth, for children up to 18 years, for all adults ages 19-59, and for adults age 60+ at high risk for hepatitis B.

SYMPTOMS














TRANSMISSION



The hepatitis B virus is transmitted through blood and bodily fluids. If you are unvaccinated or unsure of your hepatitis B status, and are exposed to the hepatitis B virus through direct contact with infected blood, a timely "postexposure prophylaxis" (PEP) can prevent an infection.
