







MANAGEMENT

Managing hep B significantly reduces the risk of liver cancer.





PREVENTION





The hepatitis B vaccine is a safe and effective vaccine that is recommended for all infants at birth, for children up to 18 years, for all adults ages 19-59, and for adults ages 60+ at high risk for hepatitis B.












SYMPTOMS
















TESTING








TRANSMISSION







The hepatitis B virus is transmitted through blood and bodily fluids. If you are unvaccinated or unsure of your hepatitis B status and are exposed to the hepatitis B virus through direct contact with infected blood, a timely "postexposure prophylaxis" (PEP) can prevent an infection.
