- Ramatu Ahmed, Founder of African Life Center in Bronx , NY
 - The organization came about as a result of her experiences in Ghana and lack of services available to immigrant communities in New York
 - African Life Center was created to serve the African immigrant communities in New York. There is also a branch that was recently established in Ghana.
 - Encourage people to attend community health trainings, advocacy events, participate in community events and health programs.
 - Organized the first African Health conference in 2016 in NY
 - Youth Drug Free Project Campaign in Ghana—managed to organize a youth conference last year on drug abuse. Use community leaders from the youth, from faith-based organizations to encourage the community to come to the conference.

What is some of the work you do specifically around health services in the community (and hepatitis B in particular)?

 Do outreach for hepatitis B education at mosques to encourage testing and improve awareness about hepatitis B in NY. Worked with the NY Dept of Health to provide training for mental health programs. Also work with women to address issues related to maternal health and cancers in women. Provide education on nutrition and the importance of balanced meals and cooking classes.

How can we start partnerships and get funding and support from City agencies?

Have to be very active in your community and beyond, walk around with flyers, attend meetings, invest your time
visiting places, organize programs, creating connections and building your networks by attending seminars,
workshops, and trainings available to the public.

Could you share more about the African Health Conference?

 Attended a conference in PA and was inspired to launch a conference in NY due to the large African community in NY. Received citations from councilmembers in NYC, especially for September 16th as a day honoring the African communities of New York.

Could you share insights on data collection for advocacy?

 Use other organizations that have more resources and work with them on advocacy projects, or collaborate on funding applications and projects. In terms of data collection, other partners will do the data collection, as African Life Center does not have the money or funding to support data collection.
