Hepatitis B costs millions, but prevention costs pennies

Hepatitis B, the world's leading cause of liver cancer, continues to impose a staggering, but preventable, burden on individuals and healthcare systems alike. Without widespread prevention and early intervention, the U.S. is projected to spend more than \$44.8 million by 2050 on hepatitis B-related care.
